Introduction to the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship

Welcome to the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship (CMDA), BSc (Hons) Health and Care Management programme. This programme will allow you to develop your existing understanding of management and organisations, whilst learning about current thinking and practice across a wide range of services in the health and care sector disciplines. This will enable you to critically reflect on and apply management theory in practice, adapt to new scenarios and implement effective solutions in the workplace.

We deliver the programme via distance learning, through a combination of:

- Live online seminars, masterclasses, and workshops.
- Guided group and project-based work.
- Research tasks.
- Discussion forums and live chats.
- Coaching.

Upon successful completion of the programme, you will graduate with the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship award and a BSc (Hons) Health and Care Management.

You will also be awarded a dual accredited qualification from the Chartered Management Institute and the NHS Leadership Academy Mary Seacole award, through successful completion of specific programme modules.

Your Programme Team

Academics

Each academic module has a dedicated academic tutor. Academic tutors are approved subject specialists. They support learners via online group academic workshops, masterclasses and online one-to-one support and feedback. The academic tutor also sets activities to be completed at the end of each masterclass to capture the learning that has taken place as well marking summative assessments for each module.

Coaches

Coaching is a key feature of the apprenticeship experience. We will partner you with a Coach at the start of your studies, to support you throughout your programme. You will meet your Coach regularly to review your progress, discuss your individual learning plan and to discuss any pastoral support you may need. Your Coach will also help you to build your e-portfolio, which provides evidence of your achievement of the Knowledge, Skills and Behaviour towards the apprenticeship.

Programme Overview, Aims and Learning Outcomes

Programme Overview and Aims

Our CMDA programme is designed to stretch learners and provide the skills to apply management theory in practice, adapt to new scenarios, and implement effective solutions.

The programme aims to provide a unique and integrative educational programme for individuals seeking to develop and consolidate their managerial achievements to become more effective managers, while delivering a professional pathway to Chartered Manager status.

In particular, the purpose of the programme is to provide learners with:

- The opportunity to demonstrate competence and professional growth, benchmarked against the Knowledge, Skills and Behaviours from the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship Standard.
- A sound platform from which to successfully progress to Apprenticeship End Point Assessment.
- A detailed understanding of and responsiveness to change, considering the future of the business environments in which they operate.
- The essential employability skills and tools to be effective ethical practitioners in a business environment.
- The opportunity to create and take ownership of a detailed work-based project, relating to a management issue.
- Those entrepreneurial skills which best support the growth of enterprise and the creation of new businesses.
- A stimulating and flexible online learning environment, which is based upon the values of openness, ownership, and professional development.

Apprenticeship Standard and Knowledge, Skills, and Behaviour

This programme is aligned to the Chartered Manager Degree Apprenticeship standard: <u>Chartered</u> <u>manager (degree) / Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education</u>. This specifies the Knowledge, Skills and Behaviours that you must evidence to successfully complete your apprenticeship.

The Chartered Manager apprenticeship award will provide professional recognition of your ability to deliver impact and behave ethically, and your commitment to continual learning and development. As a Chartered Manager, you will be able to take responsibility for people, projects, operations and/or services to deliver long term organisational success.

Degree Learning Outcomes

The apprenticeship includes an integrated degree award in BSc (Hons) Health and Care Management. At the end of the programme, you will have achieved the following degree programme learning outcomes:

- 1. Recognise the role of policy, management theory, and evidence-based practice in supporting decision making by health and care practitioners delivering outcome-based care.
- 2. Evaluate how leadership approaches, theories, tools, and models are used in a variety of health and care contexts to support effective service planning and implementation.
- 3. Assess the skills necessary to operate as an effective manager committed to a set of professional values and can lead and manage meaningful change in service delivery.
- 4. Analyse the importance of recognising the impact of critical leadership factors such as compassionate care, ethical care and equality and diversity on healthcare provision for multicultural communities.

- 5. Demonstrate knowledge of evaluation of data, digital skills, assets, and technologies to scope, plan, and carry out projects that apply critical management thinking to an organisational issue, problem, or improvement.
- 6. Evaluate the role of preventive health approaches and interventions in promoting local, national, and/or global health service management.
- 7. Analyse the importance of resource planning and management in responding to internal and external factors that influence health and care organisations during multidisciplinary teamwork.
- 8. Work independently and demonstrate a high level of autonomy for own learning and personal development.
- 9. Reflect upon own working practice, identifying areas for self-development.

Programme Structure

In levels 4 and 5, you will study one 20-credit module in each study block, in addition to and alongside a 40-credit professional practice module over three study blocks. In level 6, you will study one 20-credit module in each study block, in addition to and alongside a 40-credit work-based management project spanning the full year. See Figure 1 below.

Professional Practice Modules

The professional practice modules (Principle of Professional Practice & Advanced Professional Practice) support the achievement of the Knowledge, Skills and Behaviours for this apprenticeship standard. As these modules are fundamental to the completion of the apprenticeship award, they must be passed with a mark of at least 40% to continue on the programme and to achieve the apprenticeship award. These modules are not subject to the compensation rules set out in the Arden Regulatory Framework (see: <u>Arden University | Regulatory Framework</u>).

The professional practice modules in Levels 4 and 5 run over three study blocks to allow you to build up the required evidence for your portfolio and reflective statement. You will submit the assessments on each module at the end of the study period (in the third and final block). Your coach will regularly review your portfolio with you throughout the life of each module, to support you with your progress and provide formative feedback about the evidence you are collecting.

At Level 5, the Advanced Professional Practice module is enhanced with the NHS Leadership Academy Mary Seacole award (see: <u>Mary Seacole Programme</u>). This programme is funded by Arden University and embedded in to your Arden modules, so it is completed within your timetable schedule for Arden and hours as part of your job, nothing extra. You receive this award once you have completed it.

Assessment Strategy

In line with the apprenticeship standard, the assessment strategy has a strong alignment with real world organisational and management practice.

You will complete a range of assessments, including work-related projects, presentations, portfolios, reflections, and report writing. You will apply the knowledge and theory explored in the modules and produce assessments that focus on real situations in your organisation. The assessments will also help

you to build evidence of the apprenticeship knowledge, skills and behaviours within the BUD e-portfolio system.

Gateway

After you have finished the required pre-Gateway activities, we will hold a meeting with you and your line manager to confirm you have achieved:

- 1. The required Knowledge, Skills and Behaviours of the apprenticeship standard.
- 2. The occupational competency expected from the programme outcomes.
- 3. The learning outcomes for both the apprenticeship and the degree.

All parties must agree before you may proceed through the Gateway towards End Point Assessment. If you need any reasonable adjustments for EPA, we will notify the End Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO) at this stage, so that they can put a support plan in place.

End Point Assessment

End Point Assessment (EPA) is the final stage towards completing your apprenticeship. You will be independently assessed by End Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO) that regulates the Apprenticeship Standard that you are studying.

The Chartered Management Institute (CMI) is the recommended EPAO for the CMDA. The EPAO will contact you and your line manager to arrange a call to discuss the schedule, date and arrangements for your EPA.

During the final months of your apprenticeship, your Coach will ensure that you and your line manager are fully prepared for the EPA.

On successful completion of the EPA, the EPAO will award you an apprenticeship grading and you will receive your apprenticeship completion certificate.

Professional Accreditation

This course is accredited by the Chartered Management Institute (CMI). The Institute aims to boost career development across the management sector and connect you with like-minded professionals across diverse sectors.

As the CMI possesses a Royal Charter, they are the only organisation in the UK that can award Chartered Manager status to their members – the gold standard in management. They are also active in business policy making across the globe and ensure that their more than 140,000 members are represented in policy decision making.

As an apprentice studying with Arden University, you'll have free CMI Membership throughout your studies, giving you access to a range of additional resources including a mentoring service and invitations to networking events both online and offline.

Upon completion of your course, you will be eligible to gain a CMI qualification, which is offered at 3 different levels: an Award, Certificate or a Diploma. The final award you receive upon completion of your degree will depend on your level and length of study, whether you entered your course with Recognition for Prior Learning (RPL) or if you accept any compensation on your modules.

Successful completion of the End Point Assessment will mean you achieve Chartered Manager Status with the Chartered Management Institute: <u>Chartered Manager | Membership - CMI (managers.org.uk)</u>.
