The Alumni reception won't open until the ceremony has ended and will last for approximately 45 minutes.


Please ensure all hired graduation gowns and hoods are returned to the drop off area

About Central Hall Westminster

The wonderful location in which we are joining each other for today's graduation ceremony is Central Hall Westminster, a Grade II listed building which we hope you'll agree is a fitting location to celebrate your academic achievements.

Originally opened in 1912 as a space for worship, concerts, and public and private events, Central Hall Westminster is one of the capital's most culturally significant venues. Over the years it has welcomed many noteworthy public figures through its doors, including Martin Luther King, Mahatma Gandhi, and King Charles III, and was also the location of the Inaugural Meeting of the United Nations in 1946.

The Great Hall's breathtaking grand organ, which you'll see located behind the stage as you await your graduation moment, features 4,731 pipes; and don't forget to look up – the spectacular self-supporting domed roof above you is the largest of its type in Europe.

We hope that attending your graduation day in such a beautiful setting will create memories that last a lifetime.



Ceese Kaur Seera is a Sikh woman, fatality investigator, feminist, musician, writer, podcast host, and spoken word performer who uses her voice to raise awareness of topics that are often overlooked or shunned. Ceese is known for her strong opinions and dedication to making a difference in the world.

A passionate advocate for women's rights, equality, and empowerment, Ceese has been a participant in the UN Women UK (CSW69) online campaign for the past two years. She is deeply committed to breaking down barriers for women, particularly in the workplace, and plays an active role in promoting gender equality within policing.

As a member of the policing community, Ceese works for British Transport Police, where she is notably the Chair of the Sikh Police Staff Association, an initiative she founded just six months after joining, having identified a significant gap in representation. Through this platform, she collaborates on initiatives aimed at promoting unity and tackling racism across faith communities. Ceese has set up three forums for ethnic minorities in policing and they still stand today.

She has also pushed boundaries to make changes within the police force since joining in 2007 and having worked for three different forces. Ceese is an ambassador for True Honour, an organisation dedicated to addressing honour-based violence and forced marriages.

Ceese channels her creativity through writing and poetry, often inspired by the impact of social issues on Punjabi communities and the causes she is most passionate about. She often discusses her Sikh identity and heritage, sharing stories and reflections on her experiences. For her, writing is a powerful form of emotional expression and a means of sharing her unique perspective with the world.

Ceese believes strongly in the importance of listening and creating safe spaces for both women and men to share their voices. Her work is rooted in empowering women to make their own choices and lead change, with a special focus on inspiring and educating the next generation.





The tradition of the mace derives from medieval times in England when the mace was held by a bodyguard for dignitaries at ceremonial functions.

As an ancient symbol of authority, it reminds us that universities are custodians of both enduring traditions in learning and of the power they bestow upon those who come to learn.

The mace has become a symbol of authority and character of the institution and is carried at the head of the robed academic procession, followed by academic staff from the schools and faculties whose students are to be presented.
